



Bharti Foundation and DCM Shriram partner to implement preventive safety protocols in Satya Bharti Schools

26 February, 2021, New Delhi: Bharti Foundation, the philanthropic arm of Bharti Enterprises partnered with DCM Shriram to help prevent the outbreak of the Coronavirus pandemic in Bharti Foundation's flagship Satya Bharti Schools.

Under this initiative, DCM Shriram has donated 2355 liters of Sodium Hypochlorite and 1,074 liters of hand sanitizers to support sanitization efforts in approx 164 Satya Bharti Schools and related office locations, being run by Bharti Foundation across 4 states in India. The children studying in these schools mostly belong to underprivileged families residing in the remote villages of Haryana, Punjab, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh.

Speaking more about the partnership, Mr K.K Kaul, Director, DCM Shriram Foundation added, "Partnering with Bharti Foundation facilitated our contribution towards a cause that affects the education of thousands of children, and in turn, the future of our nation. With the outbreak of the pandemic, not only have preventive measures become of primary importance but also overall health and hygiene of the children of our country have become important; especially when we talk about underprivileged children from remote areas who do not have the means to access sanitization needs. By contributing Sodium Hypochlorite and Hand Sanitizers, we are hoping to bridge that pivotal gap."

With the world going back to normal and the schools reopening, the safety of the children attending schools has become of primitive importance. Bharti Foundation is committed to ensuring safeguarding the children through the implementation of social distancing norms, thermal checking and regular sanitization of the schools. With DCM Shriram's contribution to the cause, the Foundation's efforts will be fueled towards preventive strategies.
