



Sanjana





There are three elements that can shape a person's success – Boldness, Hard work, and Determination.



Mahima acquired 10 CGPA in the Class X and scored 93% in Class XII







JANNAT - BRINGING REAL CHANGE



Jannat and her parents lived in Udharsi village in Kurukshetra, Haryana. Even though both her parents worked, they earned a below poverty line income but toiled hard to ensure that she did not face difficulties for the bare necessities in life. Jannat, of a curious mind, would often venture about roaming around the village premises and on one such conquest, she discovered the widespread problem of open defecation. With a fiery determination in her heart, 10-year-old Jannat approached her teachers at school voicing her desire to bring a change and they encouraged her. The Satya Bharti Schools -- focus on evoking greater sensitivity to the environment and willingness to practice better hygiene amongst

its students. Even though she was determined to spread awareness about the problem of open defecation, a major hurdle was the economic burden that most families carried. After a discussion with the village sarpanch, she managed to get adequate funding that led to the construction of several toilets. Jannat, not only managed to get the process of toilet construction going, she also succeeded in educating her village to use the toilet.

SHABANA - NO HURDLE TOO BIG

Shabana Yasmin hails from an underprivileged family, living in the remote village of Dhalsa, West Bengal. At a very early age, Shabana was diagnosed with a rare nerve disease that left her with severe mobility impairment. Her mother put her into Satya Bharti School in Dhalsa, which integrates co-scholastic teaching-learning process with community campaigns. This helped her in developing life skills as well as critical and creative thinking skills through hands-on experiences. Shabana is currently in class VII and has proven to the world that with the right mindset, anything is achievable.



SAROOP SINGH - NO DREAM TOO BIG

When Saroop's parents were introduced to Satya Bharti Elementary School, Chanan Ke, it lessened their worry and they became confident about his future.

Saroop, quiet and shy by nature, hardly interacted with any of the other students and was immediately labelled by them as a timid and meek child. With a little push from his teachers, he soon came out of his shell and made new friends.

Through hard work and consistent effort, Saroop and his peers cleared the class VII exams with flying colours. He now works as a beautician and aspires to be the best professional in his conduct. He often returns to his alma mater to meet his teachers and also meets other students and guides them with career options.



RANI - THE LIGHT OF EDUCATION



Hailing from a marginalized Bhil community, Rani belonged to a family that had staunch and unshakable views on educating girls. Her father worked as a daily laborer and her mother had lost vision in both her eyes and Rani being the eldest of the three children had to shoulder the domestic responsibility of the household.

Rani would sneak around the school premises to observe classes from a distance in the hopes of learning something. She mustered up the courage to ask her parents about her prospects of getting educated, but it had no good effect.

When he learned about the Satya Bharti School in Shergarh village, Jodhpur, in the state of Rajasthan and was told that the school provided

quality education free of cost while maintaining a strong emphasis on the safety and other needs of its girl students, this gave him hope. The knowledge of a school that fit perfectly with their situation and impressed by his daughter's perseverance, he was no longer averse to the idea of education.

Rani's story of struggle became a tale of success for her siblings and many other children in her area who didn't go to school, and all of them successfully enrolled in the Satya Bharti School, Shergarh.
