This year marks a special milestone for us as we touched the lives of two million children within the academic year, through our various programs. The Satya Bharti School program – our flagship initiative, Satya Bharti Quality Support Program (QSP), and our new program i.e, Large Scale Initiative which works at scale with the government schools, reached 1.7 million children this year and has helped us achieve this landmark.

With the introduction of NEP 2020, our country has taken a giant leap in changing the landscape of Education. By bringing in focus on holistic development of students and inclusive learning, the new policy is poised to have a positive impact on millions of students and teachers.

Under the QSP, we work collaboratively with government schools, its leadership, and teachers to support them in achieving their goals towards creating a better schooling experience for their students. The positive outcomes of QSP have led to requests for scaling up the processes covering government schools at the block or district level. Programs at scale are being implemented in various states like Rajasthan, Jammu, and Assam etc. We are also taking good practices from our Satya Bharti School Program, which are aligned to the NEP, to a large number of Government Schools under our Large Scale Initiatives (LSI) program.

Our areas of intervention under this program include empowering school heads and teachers to help build life skills in students, creating engaging projects for bagless days and increasing parents and community involvement in schools to give holistic inputs and exposure to students. As of February 2023, we have reached 1.7M+ students and over 75,000+ teachers across 15,000+ schools through 641 resource people



under the LSI program itself.

We are grateful for our partnerships with the Directorate of Education, DIET, SCERT, and key academic leaders who have enabled us to provide technical support for effective guidelines of processes like, 'No Bag Day', 'Home Mentoring Program', 'Building life skills through house and club system,' and 'School Excellence Program.' This achievement would not have been possible without the dedication of our teams and the support of our partners. I would, therefore, like to specially extend my gratitude to the education departments and officers who have been instrumental in the efficient execution of Large Scale Initiatives.

I do hope that this volume of Voice of Change will inspire all of us to do more for our children!

In 2013, Bharti Foundation, in collaboration with state governments, initiated the Satya Bharti Quality Support Program (QSP) to support the government to scale up initiatives and processes in the government schools. The Program engages school leadership, teachers, students and communities for enhancing overall schooling experience in partnering government schools by incorporating good practices from Satya Bharti Schools. Built around the core philosophy of making schools engaging spaces by enabling students acquire leadership, communication, collaboration, and other skills to develop holistically. The Program's framework is structured around the whole-school approach, wherein, each school decides the pace and trajectory depending on the School leader's vision for bringing about a sustainable change.

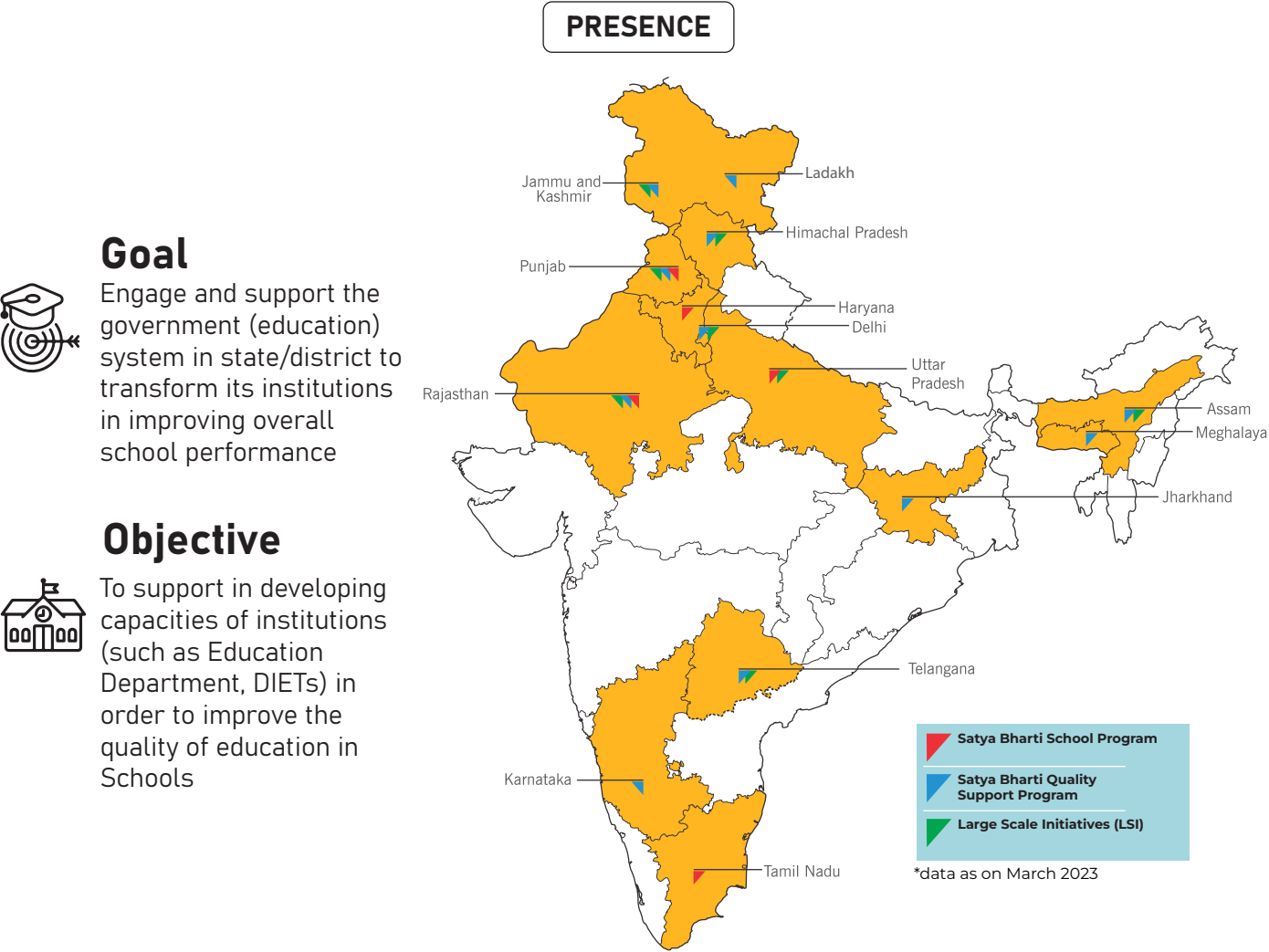
Following the success of Satya Bharti Quality Support Program, Bharti Foundation was invited by several education officers at district and state level to scale up some of the initiatives. Thus Large Scale Initiatives (LSI) was conceptualized.



# Large Scale Initiatives (LSI)

The program has taken up certain thematic initiatives to reach the schools that are beyond the partnered schools. In order to sustain similar initiatives and contribute to the education system in the state/district, large scale initiatives are envisaged. This will enhance the overall quality of initiatives that the respective state governments are making in the state.

Bharti Foundation through LSI has been supporting the government to scale up the initiatives and processes in government schools at the district/state level for overall improvement in school performance. The key areas of intervention include leadership empowerment of heads of schools, building life skills in students, creating an enabling environment at home through the home mentoring initiative, effective classroom transaction through the use of innovative teaching learning materials, improving school environment, improving parent/community participation and supporting initiatives under National Education Policy 2020.



## Stakeholder Engagement

Project Management Unit (PMU) formed at the state/ district including key members of the education department to create roadmap, prepare implementation plan, monitor, review and take decisions for project improvement.

Bharti Foundation provides technical support to the PMU in monitoring activities for school improvement in the state. The Foundation, along with education departments, identifies thematic initiatives to be implemented at scale. Further, they help in reviewing the activities undertaken and suggest corrective actions, if needed.

The key intervention areas covered under this initiative are:

### Student Empowerment

National Education Policy strongly recommends various ways and means to empower students, which will help them set meaningful priorities, giving them competence in their journey of learning.

Under LSI, Bharti Foundation is complementing government's efforts in empowering students by supporting initiatives like, **No Bag Day** across select districts in Rajasthan. The goal is to strengthen the Rajasthan Government's 'No Bag Day' policy implementation process by curating a variety of resources for various themes and groups in accordance with the Education Department's guidelines.

Further, Foundation made substantial contribution by supporting the development of Life Skills in students through Clubs and House System. The aim is to help students to acquire social, cognitive, emotional and interpersonal skills such as critical thinking, communication, management of emotions in high and higher secondary schools of Jammu Division.

### School Leadership and Teachers' Engagement

Key objective of **School Excellence Program (SEP)** is to enable the head of schools to be a visionary leaders capable of ensuring their

students strive to reach their potential. The core philosophy behind the program is to support government schools become engaging and happy spaces. The Foundation support head of schools and teachers in Rajasthan and Assam to help transform schools into a vibrant integrated institutions of learning for holistic development of students.

**Teaching-learning material (TLM)** helps teachers enhance their teaching to be more comprehensive and effective in the classroom. Bharti Foundation team capacitated budding teachers in Punjab, by helping them understand the importance of designing quality TLM and effect ways of using them in classroom to improve learning outcomes.

### Parents' Involvement

The initiative, **Home Mentoring** is designed to increase parent engagement in providing a learning environment at home and increase their awareness on the use of technology as a learning tool. Any member of the family is chosen to support the child as a home mentor, and they are oriented with a number of fundamental steps like motivating children to complete homework, revision of classwork, have a timetable and balance games with studies while pursuing interest and hobbies. Bharti Foundation supported implementation of the program in Delhi and Assam.

## Strengthening 'No Bag Day' in Rajasthan

Under Large Scale Initiatives, the Bharti Foundation provides technical assistance to ensure the effective implementation of No Bag Day in the districts of Jodhpur, Barmer, Pali, Sirohi, Jalore & Jaisalmer. The goal is to strengthen the Rajasthan Government's No Bag Day policy implementation process by curating a variety of resources for various themes and groups in accordance with the Education Department's guidelines.

'No Bag Day' was envisaged after considering adverse health issues, such as childhood back pain and the mechanical burden on young spines, which can have a negative impact on students' overall growth due to the heavy weight of their bags.

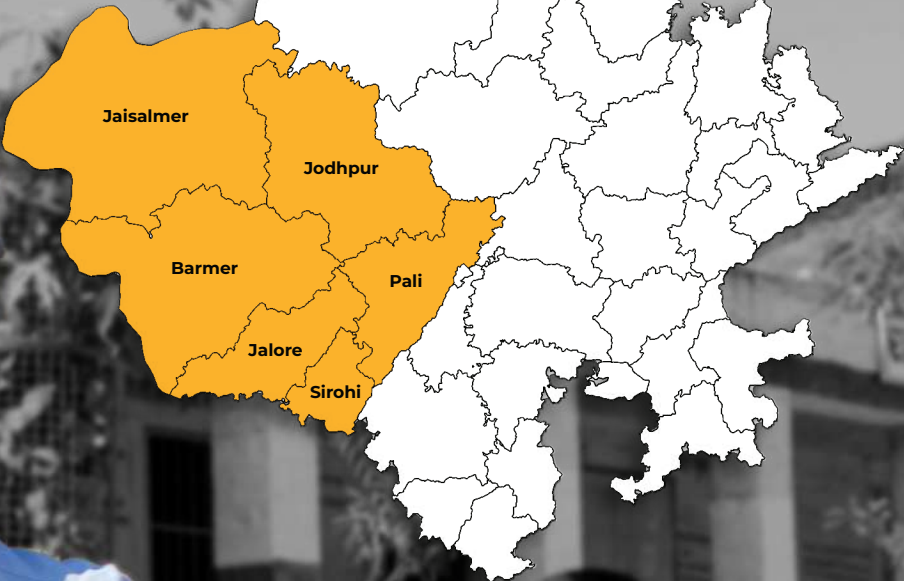

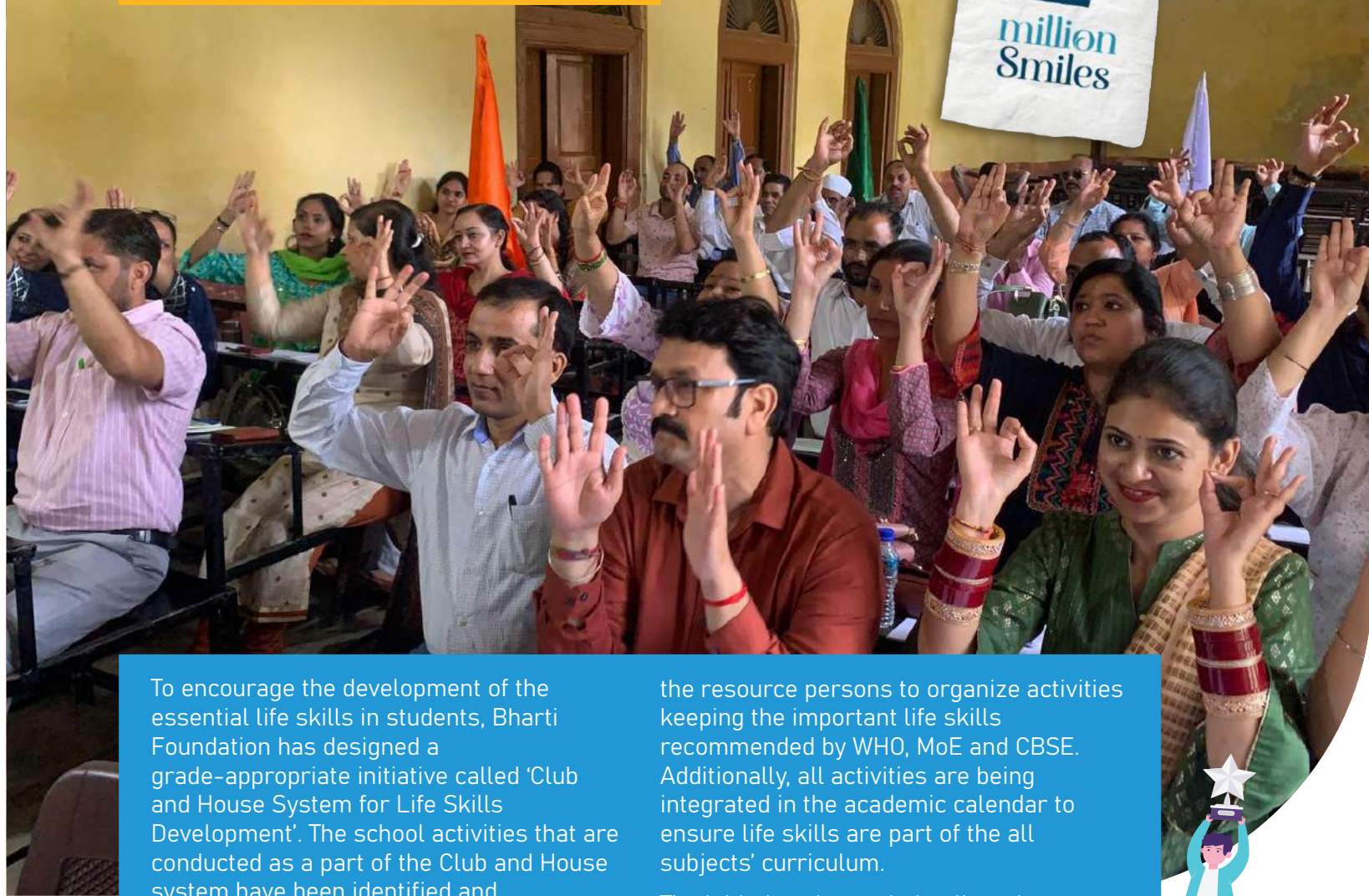

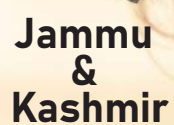

The initiative, Home Mentoring is designed to bring student, parent, and teacher together to support the students' holistic development. Any member of the family, whether it be a parent, guardian, sibling, etc., can be chosen to support the child as a home mentor. They are oriented with a number of fundamental steps.

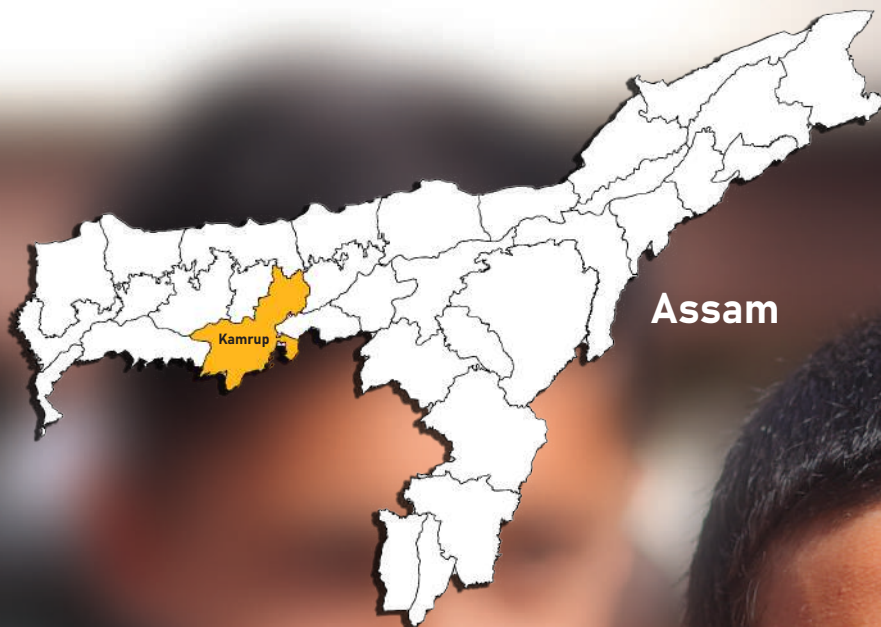
Considering that the person designated as the child's home mentor is only meant to support as a companion and guide rather than to replace a teacher, she or he is expected to mentor the child primarily in non-academic areas.

Home Mentors motivate their children to complete homework, revise classwork, create a timetable and balance games with studies while pursuing interest and hobbies. Further, home mentors are motivated to attend PTMs to discuss the progress of their children and get support for mentoring. They also support children in using digital resources wherever possible keeping cyber safety in mind.

# INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORT TO DIET

The program aims to build the capacity of future primary school teachers' to create high-quality Teaching Learning Materials (TLM). Bharti Foundation team capacitates the students who are perusing teaching courses to become teachers in District Institute of Education and Training (DIET) Bathinda. The program entitles classroom training with experiential learning as followed by evaluation, presentation and felicitation.

The program is designed to start with a 1-day training to build understanding on designing quality TLM and effective ways of using TLM in the classroom to improve learning outcomes. Subsequently, the participants are encouraged to prepare TLMs and use them in the schools. This is an important

step in giving them a hand-on on experience. The shortlisted TLMs are implemented by the "future teachers" in the school. They come back and makes the improvement and presents the learning to all the students in DIET. The program concludes with a session to provide constructive feedback on the TLM and followed by presentation on best TLM.

## Mega parental edn training on digital comm & ethics to reach over 1.5 lakh parents

● First-of-its-kind initiative by Samagra Shiksha, Kamrup, and Bharti Foundation, all set to deliver parental training across Assam

GUWAHATI, AUG 23: Samagra Shiksha, Kamrup, along with Bharti Foundation, the philanthropic arm of Bharti Enterprises, has initiated an extensive training program on Parental Education on Digital Communication & Ethics. Bharti Foundation brings in their expertise and experience in Parental engagement through Satya Bharti Home Mentoring process for parents. Under the programme, virtual training will be conducted for nine Block Resource Persons, 159 Cluster Resource Centre Coordinators who will reach out around 5570 teachers, and these Teachers will train and conduct various activities for awareness of over 1.5 lakh parents across the district. The program is now all set to impact on a scalable level in Assam through its trickle-down model. Teacher training has started from August 20.

In the current scenario as the schools are not functional due to the spread of the Covid-19, education has taken a digital turn as scholastic and co-scholastic activities are conducted through online platforms. This has helped both the teachers as well as the students to keep abreast with the coursework within the limitations of social distancing. Use of technology is facilitating this journey and has made students aware of the different ways it can aid in their all-round development. Importantly as a child studies at home, the role of the parent has also evolved as a home mentor. They need to understand the ways technology is working for their child, apart from other projects or co-scholastic activities.

Keeping this in mind, the District Education Department of Kamrup Rural and Bharti Foundation have joined hands to implement the initiative. With a belief in the philosophy of bringing about awareness among the parents and guardians of students in all Primary and Elementary Schools, the Program is run through teachers on the Concept of Parental Education - awareness on Digital communication & Ethics.

Kailash Karthik N, DC, Kamrup said, "Humanity is in a challenging state right now. While the world is battling a pandemic, it has become imperative for each one of us to address various concerns. Keeping these challenges in mind, training module was created with the objective to orient the Parents/Guardians to support Children at home to ensure continued engagement towards learning through all available virtual platforms and mediums, maintaining right use of the permissible study contents keeping aligned with the social norms and ethics with the help of teachers."

Post initial approvals, a Steering cum Monitoring Committee comprising of 15 members was formed, the advisors to this committee included Kailash Karthik N, DC, Kamrup, Dr. Uchcharan Deka, Retd. Director, SCERT, Assam, Dr. Ajit Kumar Choudhury, Retd. Principal, DIET, Morigaon and Keyur Sorathia, Professor, IIT, Guwahati. The committee will steer, guide, monitor & provide academic support to carry forward all the activities under the programme.

Speaking on the initiative, Mamta Saikia, CEO, Bharti Foundation said, "Last few months have been extremely challenging yet have shown us new ways of managing our programmes. Our teachers have stepped up their efforts and were very receptive in learning new ways of teaching using technology. This has percolated down to students who accepted the 'new' reality and despite their challenging circumstances, many of them have made the switch to e-learning. We always believe that parents play a vital role in a child's overall development. This robust training initiative that will benefit over 1.5 lakh parents on use of digital tools in education and its ethics in an extension of our commitment towards improving accessibility and quality of education across rural India."

On 26th June first meeting took place to discuss details for training over 1.5 lakh parents. The first round of training 157 personnel concluded in the last week.

Aparna Thakuria, DEEO cum DMC SSA, Kamrup said, "The first level of the training for district, block and cluster level has successfully concluded with help and support of Bharti Foundation team. We are now stepping into the second phase of educating 5,570 teachers who will further train the parents. We plan to involve each and every teacher through WhatsApp groups that have been set in place with the motive to ensure that children receive guidance and support from their parents on every aspect of digital media for a better and more focused learning."
