



Since its inception, the Foundation has reached almost 3 million children and benefited over 2.8 million community members. Further, I am pleased to share that we have taken our engagement with government schools through the Quality

The Bharti Foundation's proactive measures are not limited to school education alone. # Co-Chairman



This past year has been a momentous one, with the Bharti Foundation having reached out to more than two million students. At Bharti Foundation, we firmly believe in the transformative power of education in empowering young minds towards partaking in the nation's inclusive growth.

Satya Bharti Schools are a testament to our unwavering commitment to imparting quality education with focus on holistic development of students from underrepresented backgrounds.

With the outstanding efforts made by our teachers and staff over the years, these schools have yielded results that have made us proud. Our students have not only demonstrated proficiency in academics, but have also excelled in co-scholastic activities, be it sports or displaying their innovative and entrepreneurial ideas at State and National forums. We have are focusing on bringing technology in classrooms to enhance the overall teaching and learning experience.

What sets this year apart is that over 100 of our Satya Bharti School alumni have gotten employment at Bharti Airtel and Bharti AXA Life Insurance. Further, some alumni have joined the armed forces, while others have secured jobs with the Government, private sector or are self-employed. Many students have also gone on to pursue higher education in international universities, and have begun working in fields such as

sales, design, nursing, and management. Equally, to see our alumni return to teach and volunteer, driven to inspire children in their communities, especially girls, to complete their education and follow their dreams is a matter of inspiration and gratification to us at Bharti.

In our Quality Support Program (QSP), we engage with government schools to transform them into joyful institutions of learning. A recent study conducted by PwC reported that 83% of the teachers in these schools saw a leap in improved communication among students. The surveyed teachers also acknowledged that the program enabled enhanced leadership skills among girls, and contributed to an overall improvement in confidence levels in the students. Our program activities have also resulted in an increased participation of parents in parent-teacher meetings. What is especially heartening, is that even after completion of programs in select schools, the children have continued to carry on the good practices introduced by the QSP. Moreover, the work done through our programs has both engaged with and brought about progressive participation among communities and other stakeholders in the learning ecosystem. This only cements our belief in the fact that students and teachers are the true change agents, who when supported, can sustain quality learning that is at once delightful and educational.

Our QSP also extends to States across India, wherein we are working in collaboration with 11 State Governments in the country. In the past year alone, we have partnered with education departments in five States: Assam, Delhi, Jammu, Punjab, and Rajasthan. The program has gained significant momentum in the past few years, reaching over 1.7 million children in 2022-23. Several of our interventions, such as No Bag Day, Life Skills Training, School Excellence Program, and Home Mentoring, are directly aligned with the vision of the National Education Policy, 2020 (NEP). We will be aiming to expand our reach to other States in the coming years. We recently embarked on an exciting journey on the digital front to introduce innovative solutions through 'TheTeacherApp' to upskill teachers and empower them in elevating their teaching experience. The app will create high quality content to help teachers augment their classrooms and schools and further our synergies with the NEP.

In the realm of higher education, our work with eminent institutes such as IIT Delhi, IIT Mumbai, ISB Mohali and the University of Cambridge is continuous. Our partnership with Plaksha University is ongoing at a promising pace, with the construction of the Bharti Academic Building, we have also set up the prestigious Bharti Scholarship to award exceptional students from diverse

socio-economic backgrounds to pursue their undergraduate studies. The scholarship has been given to 37 students so far, 27% of whom are girl students.

Quality education forms the bedrock of national progress, and we are dedicated to fostering a positive impact, by partnering with various stakeholders in this endeavour to enable a systemic change in the education sector. I extend my sincere gratitude to all our partners, teachers, staff and employees for their support and contributions in this journey of realising our vision to democratise education across India.

# **CEO**

The past year has been a significant step forward in our journey of empowering underprivileged children and young individuals of our nation. I'm proud to share that we touched lives of over two million children in rural India through our education programs. Our expertise in school education through Satya Bharti Schools in the rural heartlands of India, has led us in achieving remarkable scale to provide holistic development of children.

Dedication and efforts of our teachers in the remote locations of India have been instrumental in accomplishing this milestone. Among numerous heartwarming stories, the one that stands out is that of our Satya Bharti Adarsh Sr. Sec. School teachers from Punjab who willingly conducted virtual classes to cover up teacher vacancies in our schools located in the interiors of Jodhpur, ensuring uninterrupted educational support to the children.

Equally heartening is to see the improvement in learning levels of our students after the schools resumed completely post pandemic. As per external learning level assessment of Satya Bharti School students, an overall 60% students scored above 50% whereas National Achievement Survey 2021 of the same 5 states where we are operating was 43.2%. It also highlighted that the students performed better in application items showing that they understood concepts better. We are also proud that many of our students have

transitioned from our primary and elementary Satya Bharti Schools to meritorious schools highlighting our efforts in building strong knowledge and skills in them.

Our technology interventions in the schools are also playing a key role in re-energizing the learning environment; interactive online content facilitated through digital classrooms and teaching students new age skills are helping them prepare for the future. Moreover, students of our Senior Secondary Schools in Punjab are learning robotics, coding, etc. that enabled them to compete at the national robotics championship. Our collaborative approach with more than 800 government schools through our Quality Support Program (QSP) has impacted more than 300,000 children. To foster STEM skills and digital learning, IT/Innovation Clubs were introduced in 240 partner government schools along with our other interventions to improve overall schooling experience of children. It is a pleasure to share that approximately 83% of schools where we have exited after three to five years have sustained good practices including co-scholastic activities through student clubs, participation in competitions, etc.

An Impact Assessment conducted recently by PwC for our QSP program brought out some very encouraging findings on the impact of our interventions in government schools. As per the report, higher number of activities were held in partnering government schools

resulting in instilling confidence among the students, giving them a competitive edge. The report also highlighted that 90% of students have developed a sense of ownership in organizing activities and events, while 87% of teachers experienced increased motivation and engagement since the introduction of QSP in their schools. Furthermore, community involvement in school events and volunteering has also seen 81% increase. As per the recommendations from the report, we aim to reinforce life skill development in students from Class IV - XII. The turning point for the Foundation has been the 'QSP (State/District)' wherein we have collaborated with state education departments and education bodies to implement initiatives inspired by the National Education Policy 2020 such as 'No Bag Day' in Rajasthan and 'Life Skill Development in Students' in the Jammu division. Learnings from the ground through our programs have enabled us to create an innovative solution for teachers to uplift their schools. Last year, we conceptualized TheTeacherApp, an edtech initiative for teachers across the country, to provide innovative solutions for delivery of quality education in schools.

Due to our consistent efforts through our programs, we have received several recognitions in 2022-23 such as India's 100 Best Companies to Work For, Nation Builders Award, India's Top NGOs to Work For and Top 100 India's Best Workplaces for Women -Large (Top 50) by Great Place to Work®, CSR Foundation of the Year award by CSR Box, and Stars of the Industry award for support

& improvement of quality education by ET Ascent and more.

Bharti Foundation continues to make significant strides in its mission to transform the lives of underprivileged children and empower them through education. None of this would be possible without the unwavering support of our dedicated team, teachers, donors and stakeholders. As we look ahead, we remain committed to creating a brighter future for countless more children in our nation.





Our programs are designed to transform schools into vibrant and happy leaning places through scholastic and co-scholastic interventions, thus ensuring holistic development of children. We have been able to meaningfully engage with students, teachers, parents and education administrators.



# Satya Bharti School Program

Satya Bharti School Program, the flagship initiative of Bharti Foundation, was launched in 2006. The schools under this initiative have been set-up by the Foundation for underprivileged children in rural India providing quality education free of cost, with a special focus on girl child. The program's emphasis is on holistic development of

children through academics and coscholastic activities, thus helping children progress in their journey as learners. Satya Bharti Schools also provide textbooks, notebooks, stationery, uniforms along with hygienic & nutritious mid-day meals, all free of cost.

## Child-friendly & Technology Enabled Infrastructure

Satya Bharti Schools provide a vibrant and safe learning environment for children which enhances their engagement with the school as well as both the scholastic and coscholastic activities.

The schools are equipped with digital resources, innovative and story-based pedagogy, experiential learning through projects and co-curricular activities like Bal Sabhas, art and culture, sports, language development, subject specific weeks.

On the technology front, Satya Bharti Schools are also being equipped with digital classrooms (DCRs), in addition to computer labs. Senior secondary schools and a few elementary schools in Punjab have also been provided with the advanced technology and robotic labs. Students are being given access to free digital learning apps like Chimple, TicTac Learn, Khan Academy and Hello English by also training their parents on the usage of the same to ensure safety, while using apps at home.

### **Digital Classrooms (DCR)**

DCRs facilitate technology integration in everyday teaching learning in the classrooms. Teachers use smartphones or tablets, while projecting the content on the smart TV in the classroom.

Other facilities like web cameras, speakers etc. are installed to facilitate virtual classes, webinars and online workshops enabling a better student connect with the external world.

75% Satya Bharti Schools (131) have been equipped with one digital classroom per school. Currently, its usage is limited to select subjects depending on the school requirement. Head Teachers select difficult topics and focus mainly on Science, Mathematics, EVS and English.

Teachers are supported with quality digital resources while many of them started to independently search for innovative and engaging content from web. This has not only made learning interesting and joyful for the children but has also helped teachers to improve students' participation in the classroom.

# Schools with Digital Classrooms (DCRs)

- Data reveals a positive influence on attendance in schools with DCR.
- Punjab and Rajasthan board results of Class V & VIII reflect higher scores in schools with DCR exposure.
- 70% teachers rated DCR as the most useful tool for making concepts easier to grasp.
- 66% of teachers felt that DCR significantly improved student participation.
- 59% of teachers felt that the students' attention span was significantly impacted by the use of DCR.
- 78% of teachers felt that students' collaboration with their classmates has significantly improved since the introduction of digital classrooms.

DCRs are supported by Ciena, Avaya, SMBC, SingTel, Cemtics, Kalpna Morparia.

### Robotic & Advance Technology Labs in five Senior Secondary Schools & two Elementary schools

These labs are equipped with cutting-edge technology, aimed to help improve student's skills in STEM and develop analytical, problem solving, critical thinking and decision making skills. The labs provide students with hands-on experience in robotics, coding, gaming, 3D modelling and more.




17 children participated in the World Robotics Championship, Technoxian 6.0, a national event held in Delhi in affiliation with the Ministry of Science and Technology (Government of India) and All India Council for Robotics and Automation. The event saw a participation of students from more than 300 renowned schools and Robo clubs from India and other countries.

80 students participated in the ISTO (International STEM Tinkering Olympiad), in which 20 students qualified for the international round.

7 innovative STEM based projects were selected by Inspire Manek Awards, each project won a cash price of INR 10,000.

Ericsson & Ciena have supported our schools with Robotic Labs & Advance Technology Labs.









### **Virtual Classes**

While technology has become quite integral to the education sector, especially in the last few years, it has enabled schools to access and integrate some of the progressive opportunities for their students as well as teachers.

It is only due to digital classrooms, which are equipped with a smart TV, speakers etc, that Satya Bharti Schools in remote locations also have the convenience of conducting virtual classes, where a teacher from a different location is beamed into the class through the TV for pre-defined periods and subjects. This tool has come to aid many times, in case of teachers' vacancies, absenteeism etc.



### Success story

One such success story is of Satya Bharti Schools in the remote villages of Jodhpur that did not have teachers for a few specific subjects.

Technology played an extremely crucial role with the teachers at Satya Bharti Schools in Punjab virtually beaming into the classrooms of far-flung areas of Rajasthan to provide children with the requisite education and subject knowledge for which they did not have any teacher. The students were happy to engage with the teachers from the other state and received assistance for learning different subjects.







# **Teacher Development**

Our teachers at the Satya Bharti Schools, are the key drivers of quality & holistic education thus helping our students realise their potential. Currently Satya Bharti Schools have over 1300 teachers from local communities of whom, majority are women.

At Satya Bharti Schools, we focus on developing the proficiency and competency of our teachers to motivate and empower them to perform better as mentors and facilitators for students. In line with NEP's guidance vis-a-vis continuous professional development, we equip the teachers with all the resources needed for classroom transaction like skills, knowledge, curriculum, teaching materials, etc.

### **Mentoring**

Teachers are observed and mentored by the trainers, they are also mentors through a Teacher Observation and Mentoring tool. It helps them improve through constructive feedback and develop a plan of action. Head Teachers and Principals also have the responsibility of providing ongoing guidance to teachers on everyday basis. Bharti Foundation has also initiated a teacher-training app which allows teachers to self-learn at their own pace and time (TheTeacherApp).



### **Teacher Training**

- 50 hours of continuous teacher trainings comprising of structured training modules were conducted to prepare them for the latest advances in education and pedagogy, catering to the need of 21st Century skills.
- Online, blended & self-paced learning courses: conducted through virtual mode to help them use and integrate technology for enriching the teaching-learning process.
- **TLM training & Melas:** to help teachers prepare effective Teaching Learning Materials and to help clarify difficult concepts and make classroom transactions engaging and interactive.
- SEP (School Excellence Program) for the Head Teachers: with an aim to help them gain knowledge, skills and attitude of academic leadership to enhance various parameters of quality education with an added emphasis on student learning.
- TSKT (Teacher Subject Knowledge
  Test): conducted to check the teacher's
  understanding of their respective subject
  and deriving training needs to further
  enable them for next Academic Year.

## Holistic Development Approach

Holistic development of children forms the core pillar of Satya Bharti School program, enabling children to reach their unique potential. Classified into scholastic and coscholastic sections, curriculum goes beyond academics to facilitate all-round development of children.

Each school-based process is rolled out through a comprehensive academic calendar that encompasses themes, extra-curricular activities and learning opportunities to impart knowledge, skills, values and attitudes which help children to become contributing citizens of the country.

It is important to instill a sense of social responsibility among children. Community development campaigns form an integral part of the teaching learning process, wherein children are encouraged to work alongside community members to design solutions for various social issues which may not be limited to their village even at a later stage in life. Over the years, students have addressed several social issues such as empowerment of the girl child, respect for widows, stopping child marriages, ensuring environmental protection, etc.

These student-centric community initiatives have received several accolades at international platforms such as the Design for Change School Contest, the Pramerica Spirit of Community Awards among others.

### **Student Councils**

Student councils are formed in the schools to build the leadership of students, develop a sense of responsibility, teach values like democracy, cooperation, and collaboration among students.

Students get the opportunity to participate and present their talents through various inter-house competitions such as sports, cultural, quizzes, debates, drawings, etc.



### Case study

Jagroop Kaur's journey is filled with grit and determination. She lost her father at 8 years of age, leading her to take responsibilities of her sibling and mother. Her mother worked as a support staff in a private hospital while being a constant support for her children. She encouraged Jagroop to pursue her dreams. Jagroop Kaur's success in the School Enterprise Challenge is a testimony to her hard work and dedication. Winning the Global Enterprising Student of the Year award is a great achievement which will continue to motivate her in excelling in her academic pursuits.

Jagroop Kaur desires to become a teacher to be able to help her family move out of despair and more importantly, contribute to society by sharing knowledge and skills with the younger generation.

### School Alumni

Students who commenced their academic journey at our Satya Bharti Schools in Preprimary or junior classes, have now stepped into the age for employment. Over the past few years we have seen them join the armed forces, government jobs, starting their small business or taking up private jobs as well. This year has been particularly noteworthy for us, as a number of our alumni students are joining Airtel and have embarked on their professional journey.

Several alumni of Satya Bharti Schools have also returned to our schools as teachers, driven by a strong determination to assist and empower numerous children in their community, particularly girls, who they can inspire to get educated and live their dreams.

## Community Engagement

Local communities around Satya Bharti Schools are proactively participating in school events, co-scholastic activities, volunteering work as well as social campaigns conceptualized by students on issues such as cleanliness, importance of girl child and her education, fight against drug abuse, etc. An education model embedded in the community ensures an active engagement of parents in their children's education, especially the girls. Continuous interaction with communities instills the desire to make a positive change in society.

Engagement with communities has helped the Foundation to encourage parents to have an involvement with children's learning process. A special initiative like 'Community Volunteering Week' invites the community to teach students local art, craft, folklore, local vocations, etc. The Sarpanch and the community members are also invited to all the school events fostering a sense of ownership towards the school. The close relationship that the community has developed over the years is evident in their active participation in school events.

Forums such as Parent Teacher Meetings (PTM) and School Management Committee (SMC) play a very crucial role in strengthening the school community linkages that help enhance the overall functioning of the schools. Special PTMs are held during the year like 'Mother focused PTM' to have a better connect with mothers as they play an important role in the overall development of their child; PTMs on 'effective use of mobile phones' are also held to teach parents on how to use educational apps to help enhance teaching and learning at home.

### Saksharta Bharti Abhiyan

- It is an initiative that empowers children from Satya Bharti Schools to educate the family members during their summer vacation. This initiative not only instills confidence in the children but also imparts education to community members who never had the opportunity to study in a school before.
- To promote and strengthen adult learning, our students from class 3 & above taught a total of 13,173 illiterate parents/ grandparents/ relatives.







# Our Girls Make Us Proud

It is a delight to see girls as toppers in the Board examinations every year. The success of girls in rural area is special as most of them are first generation learners in their families and are setting benchmarks for other students in the community. 

# **Quality Support Program**

The Quality Support Program (QSP) was initiated in 2013 with an aim to enhance the overall schooling experience of teachers and students of partnering government schools. It aims to transform these schools into vibrant institutions of learning through co-scholastic interventions in collaboration with school leadership. The program has been designed to positively impact students,

teachers, parents, and administrators through a standardized, flexibly implemented approach.

The program's framework is structured around the whole-school approach through co-scholastic activities that are implemented in a time frame of three to five years, under four pillars.

Under QSP various interactive activities, workshops, exposure visits and events are undertaken on a regular basis. These interventions are aimed to develop and strengthen life skills of students.

# School Leadership & Teachers' Engagement

## Highlights of the Year

Students from government schools use desing thinking to tranform innovative ideas into collaborative projects through Innovation Club. Supported over 240 such clubs in Sec./Sr. Sec. schools. 55% of the students are girls, over 50 innovative projects completed.

To promote competitive spirit, Spell Wizard (English language) and Maths Wizard competitions organized in 9 states with over 2000 government schools.

Engaged guardians in 498 partner government schools to ensure qualitative parental guidance (Satya Bharti Home Mentoring Process). Over 17021 guardians shared tips on parental guidance, 86% of the students developed their time-table.

**4088 teachers trained (34%)** in various areas such as skill modules, pedagogy and teaching methodology.

Bharti Foundation is now part of the NEP Implementation Group in Himachal Pradesh and the District Committee of School of Eminence in Bhatinda, Punjab.

Over 12,000 students groomed in communication and leadership skills to lead in-school activities through House and Club system, with over three club-led activities in a year in each school.

Inspired by NEP 2020 to initiate internships, over 180 students from 21 schools in Rajasthan and HP have been supported to undergo 10 days internship in institutions like L.R. Group of Institutions, Airtel Fiber Store, Life Insurance Corporation of India, Rajasthan Marudhara Gramin Bank, Indian Postal Department and Bank of Baroda.

Life skill (time management, problem solving, stress management, etc.) imparted to students through module based workshops, over 6200 skill workshops conducted in 800 partner schools.

Summer/winter vacation months effectively utilized to develop skills among students, Satya Bharti Skill Fest celebrated in 719 government schools.

Leadership Training in 238 schools as part of the School Excellence Program.

## Quality Support Program (Partnership for States & District level initiatives)

Based on the impact created by the Quality Support Program (QSP), several district and state level administrators requested Bharti Foundation to scale up some of the impactful initiatives at a large scale.

We created a framework under QSP (District/ State Level) program to facilitate thematic interventions, implemented in close coordination with the education officers of the area, covering schools in a district or state.

Since 2018, the program has been supporting various education departments to scale up initiatives and processes with an aim to introduce school improvement processes at scale. Since its inception, the program has already worked with many states namely Jammu & Kashmir, Punjab, Assam, Delhi and Rajasthan.

The aim of the program is to engage and support the government (education) system in state/district to transform its institutions by improving overall school performance. Bharti Foundation draws upon its field-tested processes, rural expertise and experiences gathered through its intervention in 14 states. As part of the technical support, the processes are embedded into the existing system and state/district resource groups are strengthened for effective implementation of the program.

## Implementation Approach

Bharti Foundation collaborates with state level education departments on areas of common interest to create pathways for change. The approach is to look at schools holistically and contribute towards effective implementation of National Education Policy 2020 recommendations in schools at district/state level. It acts as an enabler and extends technical expertise.

The Project Management Unit (PMU) formed at the state/district level includes key members of the education department to create a roadmap, prepare an implementation plan, monitor, review and take decisions for project improvement.

Bharti Foundation acts as an enabler while extending its technical expertise to PMU in identifying thematic initiatives that can be implemented at scale, reviewing activities undertaken and suggesting corrective actions, if required.







### **Interventions Covered**

### No Bag Day

Bharti Foundation has been complementing government's efforts in Rajasthan through effective implementation of 'No Bag Day' by curating theme based activities that are aligned with NEP 2020 guidelines. It is supporting efforts of the Rajasthan education department in achieving the vision of joyful learning while reducing the burden of school bags on children. The program is currently running in six districts - Barmer, Sirohi, Jalore, Pali, Jodhpur and Jaisalmer.

### Life Skills Development of Students

In partnership with Directorate of School Education, Jammu, the intervention empowers students with important life skills through house system in high and higher secondary schools, helping them acquire social, cognitive and interpersonal skills.

### School Excellence Program

Bharti Foundation is supporting Assam Government through School Excellence Program enabling Heads of Schools to become visionary leaders, capable of ensuring that their students maximize their potential and in overall improvement in school quality.

### **Plaksha University**


Bharti Foundation entered into a strategic collaboration with Plaksha University in 2020 to support higher education initiatives with a focus on future technologies. As a part of this association, Bharti supported the construction of the 'Bharti Academic Building', at Plaksha University campus including multipurpose hall, classrooms, boardroom, office of the VC and Dean, as well as the administrative/faculty offices.

In addition, a prestigious 'Bharti Scholarship' was instituted to award exceptional students from diverse socio-economic backgrounds to pursue full-time under-graduate studies at Plaksha University. So far, 37 students have been granted the prestigious Bharti Scholarship, of which 27% are girl students.

### **Bharti School of Telecommunications Technology &** Management, IIT Delhi

Bharti School of Telecommunications Technology & Management, Indian Institute of Technology, Delhi, was set up with a vision to develop telecom leaders through excellence in education and research. The school has emerged as a premier education centre in the country, offering specialized courses in telecommunications. Since 2002. the Foundation has awarded 168 meritorious students, of which 11 students were awarded in 2022-23.

### **Bharti Institute of Public Policy**

Bharti Institute of Public Policy (BIPP) is an integral part of the ISB Mohali campus. The institute partners with the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy at Tufts University and apart from the Advanced Management Program in Public Policy, it offers specialization in public policy through ISB's flagship Post-Graduate Program. The Foundation has been engaged with the institute at various levels including conducting CONVOKE, a teachers' conference and also participated in a leadership course for schools.

### **Bharti Centre For Communication -IIT Bombay**

The Centre hosted 18 research students and three eminent speakers from across the world and published 15 papers in international conferences and journals in the reporting year. Also, students are regularly invited for the Airtel Lecture series organized by Bharti Foundation.

### **School of Future Technologies**

School of Future Technologies at the Ahmedabad campus of Anant National University (India's first Design University) is being supported by Bharti Foundation.

# AIRTEL Lecture Series

The Airtel Lecture Series was launched in August 2007 at Bharti School of Telecommunication, IIT Delhi with the objective to provide students an opportunity to learn from the leaders, giving them insights into the best practices of the industry and extending opportunity to interact with telecom leaders.





# Governance

### Governance at Bharti Foundation

Governance at Bharti Foundation revolves around ensuring that it remains a sustainable and forward looking organisation, rooted in values, creating deep impact and learnings through targeted interventions, culminating in scalable programs before scaling up.

# Conformity to Regulations and Transparency

Bharti Foundation is a Charitable Trust. It is registered under the Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act, under provisions of the Income Tax Act and a registered CSR implementation partner in terms of the provisions of the Companies Act. We monitor and maintain adherence to all central/state/local laws and stipulations. The Foundation's activities are inspected and audited by reputed internal and statutory auditors. Ernst & Young is the Internal Auditors for the Foundation and the annual Statutory Audit is done by Deloitte Haskins & LLP. We also undergo audits by donor appointed auditors.

#### **Inclusive and Safe Environment**

The Foundation provides for an inclusive environment. We boast of diversity at workplace, with members from distinct backgrounds. The majority of our teaching staff and a fair proportion of our non-teaching staff is female. A large number of the beneficiaries of our programs belong to underprivileged background. Ensuring a safe space for all employees remains a top priority at Bharti Foundation.

The Foundation established an Internal Complaints Committee in 2013 for the Prevention of Sexual Harassment (POSH) of Women at Workplace Act 2013. There was no case reported to the Committee during the year 2022-23.

The safety of children in our schools remains a top priority for the Foundation, and it finds a special place in our School Operating Manual. All schools are under CCTV surveillance, and there are separate toilets for girl students.







### **Monitoring and Evaluation**

The primary goal of the monitoring system is to bring forth the facts or reality from the grassroots, identify gaps and improvement levels, chart future plans, and bring positive changes in rural communities. Our programs are also assessed by third party professionals for wider impacts.




